Immunization Information

The <u>Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA)</u> requires all Public Health Units in Ontario to have a complete record of immunizations or an exemption for the following diseases:

- Diphtheria
- Tetanus
- Polio
- Pertussis (whooping cough)
- Measles, mumps and rubella
- Meningococcal disease
- Varicella (chicken pox) (for students born on or after 2010)

Parents who would like to have their child/children receive these <u>free</u> vaccinations from their family physician or by attending a Public Health Immunization clinic.

Immunization Exemption

To protect the health and safety of all children in our community, all public health units in Ontario are required by law to: Collect, review and update immunization records of children registered in schools in our region under the <u>Immunization of Schools Pupils Act, 1990.</u> Collect, review and update immunization records of children in licensed child care centres under the <u>Child Care and Early Years Act, 2014.</u>

Parents or guardians seeking an immunization exemption for a child attending a child care centre or school will need to provide one of the following:

- A letter stating that the immunization conflicts with religious or conscientious beliefs
- A written statement from a physician or a nurse practitioner giving medical reason(s) why the child should not be immunized

If a parent continues to seek an exemption due to religious or conscientious reasons once a child enters school, a statement of conscience or religious belief affidavit, signed by a Commissioner for Taking Affidavits, will be required.

In Ontario, children are also eligible to receive <u>free</u> vaccines for Hepatitis B, Meningitis (ACYW-135) and HPV at school at age 12.

Other vaccines which may be available with a prescription from your health care provider include: Hepatitis A & B, Meningitis (Group B strain) and Meningitis ACYW-135 (ages 2+).
